## **Anti Ragging Regulations:**

Ragging is legally banned. It is punishable offence in view of the increasing number of events of ragging. The AICTE passed the Regulations "AICTE Approved Technical Institute Vide No.37-3/Legal/AICTE/2009 Dated:1-7-2009"



Ragging is any conduct by "Any student or students whether by words spoken or return or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student or including in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student which causes or likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing of power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

The Anti-Ragging committee may, depending on the nature & gravity of the guilt established by the anti-ragging squad award to those found guilty one or more of the following punishments namely:

- Suspension from attending classes & academic privileges.
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship, fellowship & other benefits.
- 3. Debarring from appearing any tests / examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- 5. Debarring from representing the institute in any regional, national, international met, tournament, youth festival etc.
- 6. Suspension from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- 8. Rustication from the institute for period ragging from one to six semesters.
- 9. Expulsion from the institute & consequent debarring from admission to any other institute for a specified period.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment. The students are advised to consult the anti-ragging committee in case of emergency.
